Solution to our hygiene picture puzzle

The tops of hygiene:

- ✓ **Dispensers at the point of care** – here, directly on the bedframe – are fundamental for being able to disinfect hands at the right moment.
- ✓ **All necessary materials prepared on a tray** support hygienically perfect work processes.

The flops of hygiene:

- ✗ **Wristwatch and nail polish** endanger a comprehensive hand disinfection and provide pathogens with niches.
- ✗ **Stethoscopes** are carriers of pathogens and belong in the pocket and not around the neck of the employees.
- ✗ The patient bed is a potential source of infection and therefore **no place** to put down work utensils.
- ✗ **Missing dispensers** at the point of care prevent staff from disinfecting their hands during patient care.

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
