Preventing sepsis: It is in your hands

Sepsis is an underestimated complication of nosocomial infections.

Six million deaths worldwide every year* and thus one of the most common causes of death.

Almost every fifth patient dies.

Hand hygiene plays a key role in preventing sepsis, because: every third nosocomial infection can be avoided by enhanced hand hygiene – and thus also many cases of sepsis.
